Service Category Description and Examples of Activities/Organizations/Non-Profits

1. <u>Animals</u>. Assist with education and support activities, including caring for animals, educating prospective owners, assisting with adoptions, and fund-raising.

Orgs: Adoption Day at Pet Shops, Animal Shelters, Aquariums, Foster home for animals, Therapy programs, Zoos, etc.

2. Arts & Culture. Assist with activities to promote and sustain the art and cultural events in the community including teaching music or art, giving tours at museums or homes, etc.

Orgs: Art Gallery, Community Band, cultural events, Interpretative Guides, Museum, Tourists Centers, etc.

3. <u>Community</u>. Participation in events such as painting, rebuilding, refurbishing, construction, and landscaping in a community. Shreveport Examples: • Paint Your Heart Out- paint homes and complete minor, essential home repairs for disabled, low income, senior, and veteran homeowners as well as food banks and hospitals.

Orgs: Beach clean-up, Boys and Girls Clubs, Boy Scouts, coastal restoration, Girl Scouts, Habitat for Humanity, Kiwanis, Make A Difference Day, Paint Your Heart Out, Rotary Club, etc.

4. <u>Crisis Support</u>. Participation in fundraising and educational events to support individual crises such as home fires, death in families, job loss, etc.

Orgs: Children's hospitals, Children's Miracle Network, Make A Wish Foundation, St. Jude's, Shriners' Hospital

5. <u>Disaster Relief/Emergency/Safet</u>. Participation in fundraising and direct action events to support rebuilding of communities devastated by unexpected event such as hurricane, tornado, flood, explosion, etc.

Orgs: American Red Cross, Salvation Army, United Methodist Committee on Relief (UNCOR), etc.

6. Education/Literacy. Participation in activities to support education including tutoring.

Orgs: Coach, tutor, Host an exchange student, Library volunteer, Mentor, Referee, Tutor, Volunteers of America

- 7. Environment. Participation in activities, educational events and fundraising focused on preserving the environment.

 Orgs: Apprentice Ecologist Initiative, Keep America Beautiful, Nature Conservancy, Green School projects, Louisiana Environmental Education Commission projects, etc.
- 8. <u>Faith-Based</u>. Participation in a service activity sponsored/hosted by a religiously affiliated organization, program, or congregation (church, mosque, synagogue, or temple). Weekend of the Cross (Fri-Sun event for high school/college age students to work to repair, refurbish, and rebuild in a designated community

Orgs: Acolyte, Altar Servers, Church or Vacation Bible School (VBS)Team member Citi IMPACT Ministries, Nursery, Mission trips, Rescue Mission, Retreat planning teams, Week-end of the Cross, etc.

9. <u>Health, Medicine, Wellness</u>. Participation in fundraising and educational events to increase awareness about health concerns, medical needs, and improved wellness of community.

Orgs: American Cancer Society, American Heart Association, Candy Striper or Hospital Volunteer, Hospice, Marathons, March of Dimes, Nursing Home, Races, Relay for Life, etc.

10. <u>Homeless, Housing & Hunger</u>. Participation in fundraising and educational events to support individuals and families without homes or adequate shelter and food.

Orgs/Activities: Coat drives, Food bank, Heifer International, Homeless shelters, Soup kitchen, Uniform drives,

11. Veterans & Military. Participation in fundraising and education events to support retired or active duty military.

Orgs: American Legion, Sons of the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), Wounded Warrior, etc.

12. Other. Activities that enhance the well-being of others.

Orgs/Activities: Advisory Councils for parishes or nonprofits, Nursing home volunteer, Senior Citizen Volunteer.
